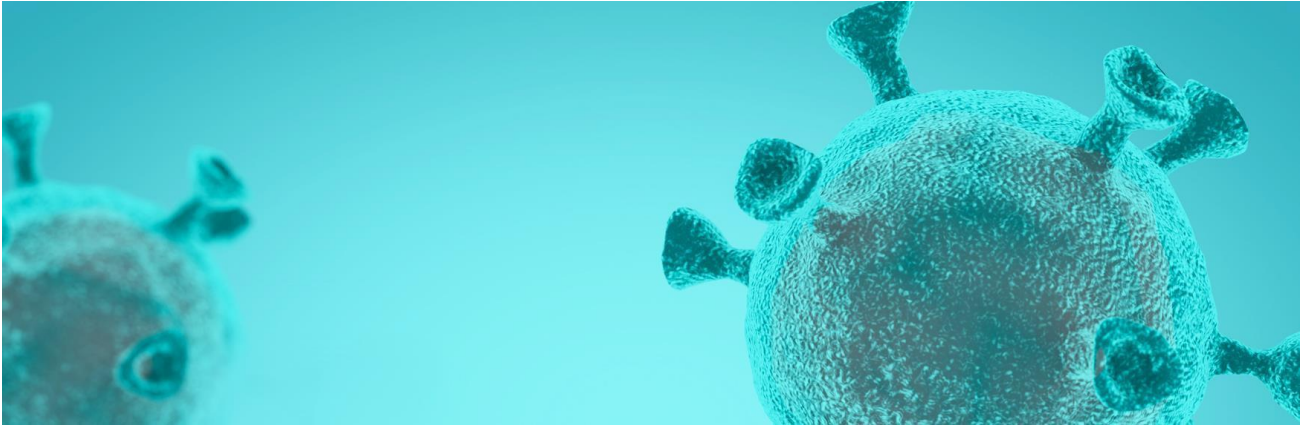


ONTIER MEXICO - COVID 19



Criminal complaint for COVID-19 contagion

In Mexico today, the Federal Criminal Code ("*CPF*") and some local criminal codes define the crime of "Danger of Contagion", which is considered a crime against health.

WHAT DOES THE CRIME OF DANGER OF CONTAGION CONSIST OF?

This crime consists of intentionally transmitting a serious illness, i.e. a person who is aware of suffering from a serious illness and who is in a phase of infection, puts in danger of contagion, by any means transmissible, to a third party who is not aware of this circumstance.

At present, article 159 of the Mexico City Criminal Code provides that anyone found guilty of this crime may be sentenced to:

- 3 months to 3 years in prison and a fine of 30 to 50 days.

- In case of an incurable disease 3 months to 10 years imprisonment and 500 to 1,000 days fine.

Anyone who, knowing that he or she is infected with or carries the COVID-19 virus, does not correctly comply with the isolation measures derived from the declaration of the health emergency due to force majeure, could be convicted of the crime of Danger of Contagion.
